Assessment Revaluation

Every four years, all Saskatchewan properties are revalued – for property taxation purposes. The last revaluation was in 2013 and used a base date of January 1, 2011. Since then the province has experienced unprecedented economic growth and the value of property has followed this trend. Rocanville is no exception, in the last five years, property values have increased dramatically.

All Rocanville properties have been revalued for use in 2017 and owners will receive Assessment Notices shortly, the new base date used is January 1, 2015 and again property values have increased by approximately 15%. Most properties will see increases to their assessment – this will not necessarily translate into property tax increases. For instance, the Town's 2016 uniform mill rate was 10 and the minimum tax was \$1,550 which, combined, generated \$675,210. Even if assessments increase, Town Council has the ability to limit municipal property tax increases by adjusting the mill rate.

As you know, a portion of your property taxes are paid to the South East Cornerstone School Division. The Province sets education mill rates for residential, commercial and agricultural properties. The Town collects these education monies and pays it directly to the School Division office in Weyburn. In 2016 this amount was \$265,680.

Invoices from the Town of Rocanville can be paid online through several financial institutions, by preauthorized debit or by using your debit card. Sorry but credit cards are not accepted. Please call the office at 306 645 2022 for more information.



SAFE TRAVELS

Do you know what to look for when buying travel insurance?

Whether it's heading south, to a beach, embarking on an overseas adventure or just crossing the border for a weekend shopping trip, most Canadians enjoy travelling. And, given winter's icy grip, it's no wonder many of us look forward to getting away at this time of year. In January and February 2016 alone, Canadian residents went on 8.7 million outof-country trips. What's surprising, though, is that only 47 percent of Canadians say that they always purchase travel insurance. according to a survey by the Travel Health Insurance Association of Canada (THiA).

The Ins and outs of coverage

Knowing what travel coverage you may have or need is not always easy. For example, some travelers may assume that they have comprehensive coverage through their provincial plan, a credit card or a work plan. According to the THiA survey, 67 percent of respondents were unsure if provincial health plans cover outof-province medical care, and 40 percent didn't know what kind of travel insurance coverage they had. What is clear is that you shouldn't have to spend your vacation worrying about travel coverage. Here are some points worth considering before you depart:

-If you're travelling outside of Canada, your provincial or territorial health plan may only cover a set rate for emergency health services for an acute, unexpected condition, illness or injury requiring immediate treatment

-emergency health services provided outside the country can cost much more than government health insurance service may pay, with travelers left to pay for the rest

-Hospitals and Clinics in some countries may refuse to treat patients who don't have adequate travel health insurance or the money to pay their bills.

Knowing what to look for

At the highest level, your travel insurance should include medical, emergency trip cancellation/interruption, baggage, accidental death dismemberment coverage. From there you can get more customized depending on your personal situation zeroing in on coverage eligibility, terms, conditions and restrictions. Consider whether the

-has a worldwide, 24/7 emergency hotline with translation services -pays up front for foreign hospitalization and related medical costs, so you don't have to pay out of pocket

-clearly explains deductible costs -covers pre-existing medical conditions. Note: its's crucial to understand the pre-existing condition coverage and how it applies to you

-specifies no exclusions or limitations related to your destination

 -does not exclude activities or sports you plan to take part in -can be extended if you choose to lengthen your trip

-covers the preparation and return to Canada of your remains if you die while traveling

Carry your travel insurance card: in addition, leave a copy with our insurance information and travel itinerary with a family member or close friend at home. Consult travel advisories as advisory issued after you make your travel arrangements can affect your insurance. Advisories can be accessed through

travel.gc.ca/travelling/advisories Check in with your doctor

Make an appointment at least six weeks in advance of your trip, so your physician can advise about any medications or vaccinations you may need. This also applies when you return home, if you are not feeling well.

Visit Tourism websites for your destination

These sites often offer specific information about the region (climate, bugs, drinking water, etc.) that can help you prepare.
