HAVE GRANDKIDS – WILL SPOIL – How to be a generous grandparent while also being financially prudent.

Most grandparents agree- having grandchildren is one of the most fulfilling experiences in life. 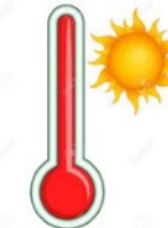

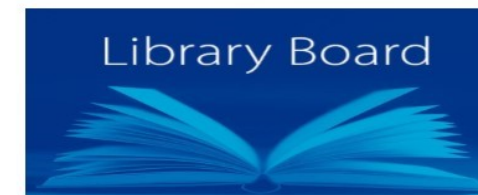

2019 BUDGET

The 2019 Budget was set at the Council meeting held on the 5th June.

Sask Energy Grant-in-Lieu \$22,000

Sask Power Grant-in-Lieu \$55,000

Revenue Sharing \$178,111

\$140,000 for annual street repairs

\$95,800 to Red Coat Waste to cover garbage and recycling collection within the Town

\$125,000 completion of lift station upgrades

\$20,000 sewer camera and locator

\$15,000 new well pump

2019 TAX LEVY

The 2019 Tax notices have been mailed. Council has taken the decision to keep the minimum tax for all land and properties at \$1,700 for 2019. Which means there is no increase in your taxes unless improvements have been carried out in the last year. 2019 Tax levy will generate \$706,600.

2018 Financial Statements

The 2018 Financial Statements have been audited and a full copy is available for inspection at the Town office during regular business hours.

A synopsis is included on Page 3 & 4 of this calendar.

Please ensure that all sump pumps are being pumped out onto your yard or to the street. We allow that sump pumps be pumped into the sewer only during winter months. Pumping directly into the sewer could overload our Lift Stations during storms.

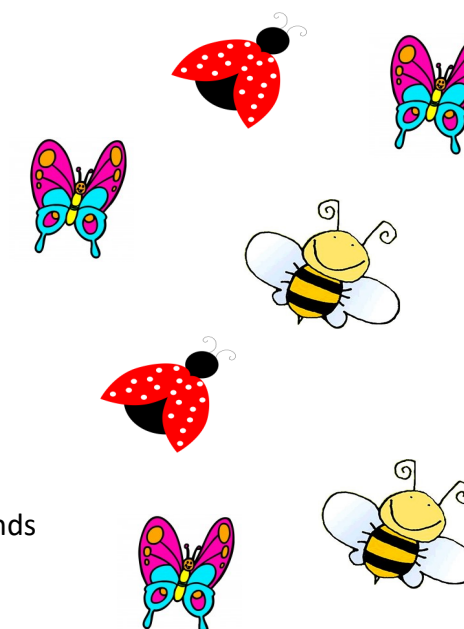

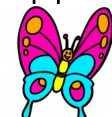
