Understanding the difference between a personal advisor and "robo-advice"

Comparing software to a relationship with an expert.

Automated portfolio management services – known popularly as "robo-advisors" – have made headlines in recent years. These online services use algorithms to make portfolio recommendations based on the information an investor provides in a questionnaire. These services are just starting to gain ground in Canada, with marketing campaigns that include TV. Although most investors continue to work with human advisors, the rise of web-based investment platforms has made understanding the difference between the two – robo-advisors and human advisors – more important than ever. commercials, billboards and full-page ads.

How does "robo-advice" work?

Because these platforms do not offer individualized advice, the term "robo-advisor," although catchy, is a misnomer. It is actually just software. When a client registers for a service, she or he answers a set of questions that determines a generic investor profile. The software then presents the client with choices of ready-made portfolios based on the profile.

Because the profiles are formulaic – quite literally based on a mathematical formula – they can only account for a limited range of goals and risk tolerances. Robo-advisor software is designed to sort clients into broad categories and to serve those categories quickly and at a lower cost. This model relies on the investor answering the questionnaire accurately. It also places the responsibility of choosing the best portfolio on the client instead of the advisor, because there is no advisor.

The role of an advisor

Human advisors are licensed experts who create comprehensive financial plans designed to build wealth, minimize taxes, and accomplish a diverse range of other goals. These may include everything from being able to afford next year's vacation to

Buying a home to living comfortably in retirement. Because money is more than an account balance – it's a family's home, a child's university tuition, an emergency fund for tough times – creating a plan requires understanding the emotional importance of each financial goal.

An advisor also does much more than portfolio rebalancing. She or he can help rearrange investments for tax efficiency, review budget and saving strategies, and put in place the right financial protection.

As a result of understanding the full picture of a client's life, a financial professional can handle varying degrees of complexity. If a client experiences major changes, plans can be adjusted to respond to the client's new circumstances.

By the same token, if the economy changes, an advisor has the depth of knowledge to provide a proper analysis and plan of action. When faced with the decision of staying the course or making an adjustment, you can sit down with an expert intimately familiar with your investments. An advisor can evaluate what the decision will mean, not just for your portfolio, but for your long-term financial well-being.

The bigger picture

One of the primary advantages of working with an advisor is nuanced "big picture" planning. Investing is not so much about buying a product; it is about acquiring the component parts of a far-sighted strategy. Ideally, investments complement each other and click neatly into place within a financial plan. They are allocated to generate growth or provide an income, to meet short- and long-term goals, to save taxes and to build a legacy. Furthermore, the plan must adapt – and the investments must be rebalanced – as the investor's circumstances change.

That is why off-the-shelf products available through "robo" portfolio management do not always generate the most value. One recent study compared investors who work with advisors to investors who don't. After four to six years, the advised investors had accumulated savings worth nearly 1.7 times as much as the unadvised investors. After seven to 14 years,

they were up to 2.9 times as much. After 15 years, they had amassed 3.9 times as much. This suggests that the longer people work with an advisor, the more they benefit from advice.

Translating a vision into a plan

Because priorities change and what's right today need not be a forever decision, a financial plan that takes into account a variety of objectives is essential. When it comes right down to it, beating the market is not anyone's true objective. That is just a means to an end. The end is the flexibility to live life as you want and reach your financial and life goals.

An advisor's unique skill set supports the ability to translate a client's vision into a concrete, achievable plan. While financial acumen is part of that skill set, so are perspective, context, and the capacity to help a client stick to a plan for years. Maintaining trust and motivation takes more than a mathematical formula – it takes a real relationship.

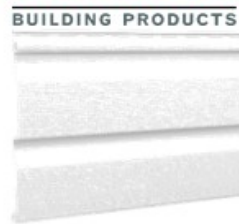

WATERWORKS CAPITAL INVESTMENT STRATEGY

On August 18, 2021 Town Council will pass a resolution on a capital investment strategy.

The objective of the waterworks capital investment strategy is to address anticipated waterworks infrastructure maintenance, the immediate drinking water infrastructure problems and future infrastructure replacements in a timely fashion so as to ensure the municipal waterworks provides safe drinking water to residents and businesses. The strategy uses the 2020 waterworks system assessment (WSA) that was required by Saskatchewan Environment for infrastructure planning.

The Town of Rocanville's WSA, compiled by AECOM Canada Ltd., contained no recommendations that required immediate correction. The most expensive item addressed was the 'aging motors and piping and continued replacement of the cast iron distribution pipe'. The community's quarterly "Infrastructure Fee" was increased on August 1, 2015 from \$39.00 to \$94.50 to generate the funds required to replace aging water mains

This capital investment strategy will ensure that safe drinking water can be provided to the residents and businesses of the Town of Rocanville and area in the present and future.

WATERWORKS RATE POLICY

On August 18, 2021 Town Council will pass a resolution on a waterworks rate policy. Under the waterworks rate policy resolution, the water rates as follows will continue, as adopted under the Water and Sewer Rates Bylaw dated April 15, 2015:

Water Charges For Customers Located Within Town Limits

All customers shall be charged a basic cost per quarter of \$40.50 minimum. Regardless of meter size, the volume of water allowed under the minimum cost per quarter shall be 10,000 gallons. Excess water consumed, over 10,000 gallons, shall be charged at the rate of \$4.05 per 1,000 gallons.

All customers shall also be charged an Infrastructure Fee in the amount of \$94.50 per quarter. The purpose of the Infrastructure Fee is to generate new monies to fund capital projects.

Water Charges For Customers Located Outside Town Limits

**Or
Customers Accessing Water At Key Operated Outlet For Agricultural Use:**

5/8 Inch Meter (Domestic) and 3/4 Inch Meter (Domestic & Commercial) – Basic cost per quarter shall be \$63.30 minimum. Volume of water allowed under the minimum cost per quarter shall be 10,000 gallons. Excess water used over 10,000 gallons shall be charged at the rate of \$6.33 per 1,000 gallons.

1 Inch Meter (Commercial) – Basic cost per quarter shall be \$158.25 minimum. Volume of water allowed under the minimum cost per quarter shall be 25,000 gallons. Excess water used over 25,000 gallons shall be charged at the rate of \$6.33 per 1,000 gallons.

1 ½ Inch Meter (Commercial) – Basic cost per quarter shall be \$379.80 minimum. Volume of water allowed under the minimum cost per quarter shall be 60,000 gallons. Excess water used over 60,000 gallons shall be charged at the rate of \$6.33 per 1,000 gallons.

2 Inch Meter (Commercial / Agricultural) – Basic cost per quarter shall be \$633.00 minimum. Volume of water allowed under the minimum cost shall be 100,000 gallons. Excess water used over 100,000 gallons shall be charged at the rate of \$6.33 per 1,000 gallons.

Waterworks Rate Policy

All consumers will be eligible for a 5% discount on current charges only when paying during the month of invoicing (February, May, August and November). A penalty of 10% will be added to all water and sewer accounts outstanding at the date of the next billing.

Basic charges that vary due to water meter size are justified because the Town's infrastructure was built to accommodate their potential requirements.

The objective of the waterworks rate policy is to ensure that waterworks are self-financing, where the users pay for the cost of the service. To accomplish this, waterworks rates need to be regularly evaluated to ensure that revenues cover operating costs and provide excess monies to build reserves in order to cover future infrastructure maintenance and replacement costs. These future capital expenditures have been identified in the 2020 waterworks assessment required by *The Water Regulations, 2002*.

Including both operating and capital expenditures, the utility department concluded 2020 with a loss of \$20,213.88 this loss was subsidized through infrastructure fees. In recognition of an upcoming, long-term capital project (to replace aging water mains), Town Council successfully applied to increase the quarterly infrastructure fee from \$39.00 to \$94.50. This took effect August 1, 2015.

To be fair to water customers residing within the community, Council increased rural rates effective February 1, 2010.

In 2013, the Town of Rocanville installed a variable frequency drive in Well #2 and we continue to convert traditional water meters over to electronic meters with 394 of the required 400 installed. All meters have now been converted to electronic and are read quarterly with a handheld reader.

In 2018 water lines were extended through Qu'Appelle Street and looped to the Trailer Court to provide a continuous line to avoid dead ends which creates turbidity and also supply this end of Town with Fire Hydrant service.

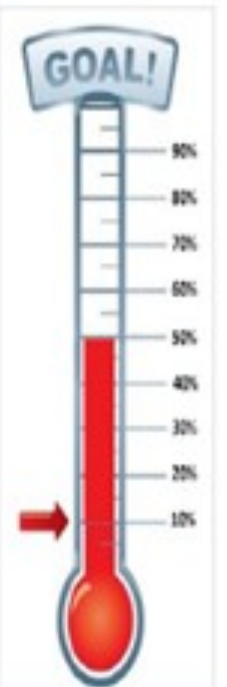

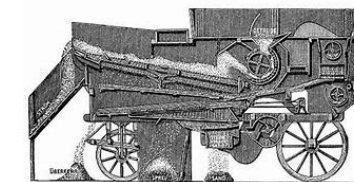

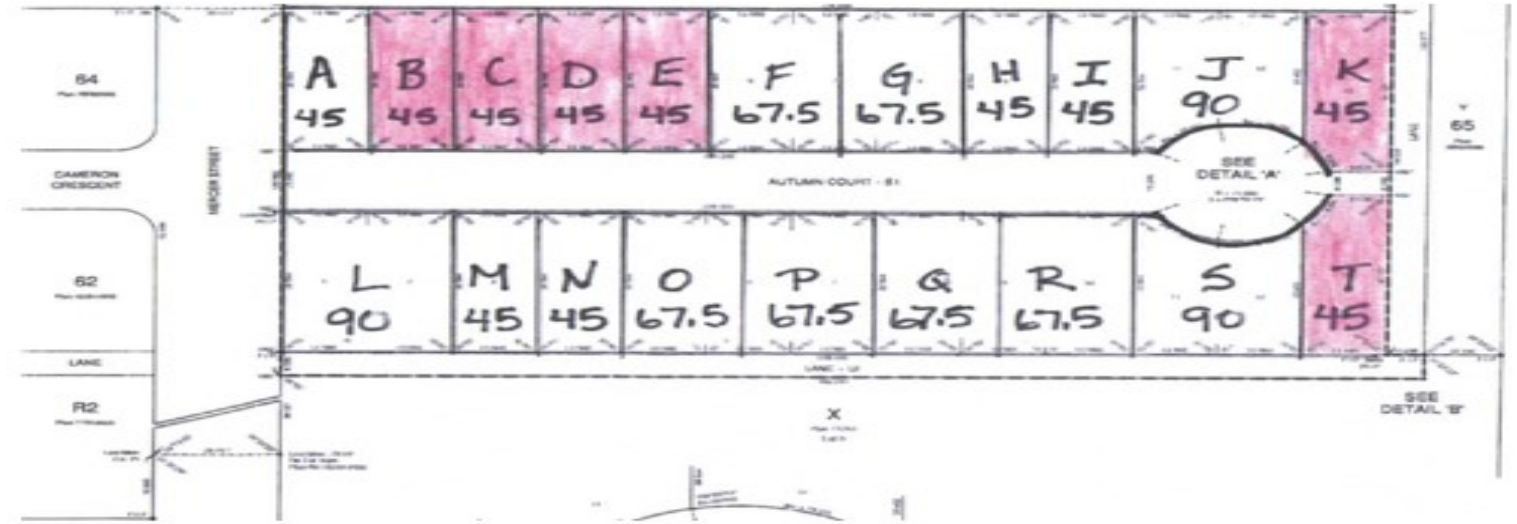
