The whole deal

Whole life insurance provides lifelong protection with valuable additional features.

Choosing the right life insurance solution for your situation is extremely important – but the process can feel overwhelming since there are so many different products available.

There's **term life insurance**, which offers straightforward coverage for a specific number of years. There's **universal life insurance**, which provides lifelong protection and includes the opportunity for tax-sheltered investment growth. Often less well understood is whole life insurance, which provides lifelong protection, like universal life insurance, but with different features.

How does whole life insurance work?

Whole life insurance is what's known as a permanent insurance policy. Regardless of how long someone lives and whatever health issues that person encounters, beneficiaries will receive the guaranteed death benefit. The only requirement is that premium payments – often referred to as modal policy payments – must continue to be made according to a set annual or monthly schedule.

With some whole life insurance policies, beneficiaries may receive more than the death benefit, which is the face amount on the policy. They may also get the amount of "paid-up insurance." This is extra coverage the policyholder bought either using the policy's earnings or by depositing additional payments. In some policies, paid-up insurance only increases the death benefit. In others, it also increases the policy's "cash value."

The cash value is an amount that accumulates inside the policy which the policyholder can access while still alive. Not all whole life insurance policies have a cash value, but it is a useful feature that offers flexibility if the policyholder needs an extra source of funds. Some policies offer

guaranteed cash values, providing helpful certainty for planning.

Many whole life insurance policies offer another useful feature: the choice to arrange to pay off the entire policy by a certain age (e.g., 90 or 100) or in a specific number of years (e.g., 10 or 20 years). The latter option, also known as limited pay, allows the policyholder to pay all the modal policy payments early on. This can help with planning because it ensures no more payments are due after retirement or at a time when someone anticipates needing funds for extra care at home or perhaps in a long-term care facility.

How do policies add value?

Different policies offer a variety of extras that can add value for policyholders, such as:

- Allowing policyholders to make extra deposits that build cash value and/or face value
- Offering annual performance credits that build the policy's cash value and/or face value
- Offering annual dividends that build the policy's face value and cash value
- Facilitating cash value withdrawals when needed – note that these withdrawals are generally subject to tax, but may be tax-free if the policyholder becomes disabled
- Allowing the policyholder to use the cash value as collateral for a bank loan
- Permitting the policyholder to decrease the policy's face value as their needs change

It may also be possible to add features through riders – for example, increasing protection with term life insurance, including the option to skip payments if the policyholder becomes disabled, and protecting children and guaranteeing they will qualify for their own policies when they grow up.

Who can benefit?









Like all life insurance, whole life insurance can be part of an overall strategy to maximize your legacy, providing a guaranteed, tax-efficient death benefit that

you can pass on to the next generation. It can also fund a sizeable charitable donation.

The cash value makes it possible to access money if needed – for example, to pay for unexpected costs such as home repairs or home care services. Also, the cash value grows on a tax-deferred basis, meaning taxes are due only on withdrawn amounts, making this a tax-efficient way to build wealth.

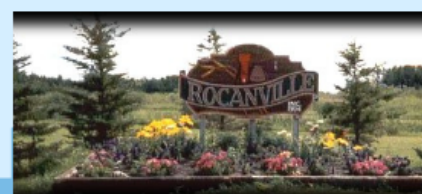

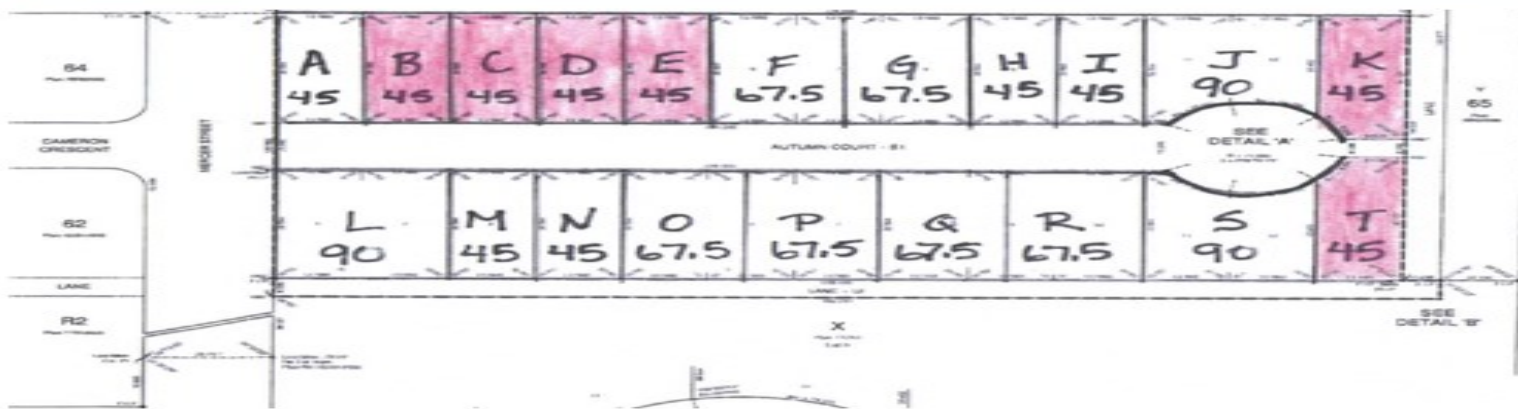

Questions from the public:

- **Will my taxes increase if we continue with the renovation project?** *It is possible that your taxes could increase. The increase would be at a MAXIMUM of \$700/year (\$59/month). If taxes do increase, they would be reviewed yearly. The Town, Rec office, and Pool Fundraising Board are working very hard to prevent taxes from increasing by filling out grant applications, looking for sponsors and donations, and fundraising.*
- **Can't we take the roof off the pool and convert it to an outdoor pool?** *The grant that we are receiving is for a refurbishment of the existing building. If we were to convert our pool to an outdoor pool, we would likely lose the grant money. Converting our existing pool to an outdoor pool would also be a costly project as we would still require a mechanical room, change rooms, and admission/office. Outdoor pools have smaller operating seasons, and many surrounding communities have outdoor pools so we would lose our uniqueness.*
- **Profit and Loss statement? Will the pool be self-sustaining?** *Pools in general are not money makers and require ongoing fundraising to keep them sustainable. We are providing a service by having a pool in our community. The pool is a drawing card for families to choose our community for their home and helps to generate revenue for our local businesses. When people visit our community to use any of our facilities the hope is that they will also visit some of our stores.*
- **Will we be asked for more tax dollars once the new facility is here?** *No, the \$700 tax increase would be a worst-case scenario and taxes will not be increased further to support the pool. If the pool requires further support that would be done through fundraising, grants, donations, etc.*
- **What will happen with the money that has been raised so far if the referendum does not go through?** *Any money remaining after paying the engineering fees would be divided up amongst our operating facilities.*
- **If we do not go ahead with the refurbishments, will we be able to continue to use our facility as it is?** *Highly unlikely. Our facility is at the end of its life cycle. We need to do these renovations to save our pool. We have looked at just putting in a liner or just putting in a new air exchange etc but after some thought, we realize that doesn't make sense. A liner alone will not help with our humidity issue. The humidity the pool is experiencing is creating a mold problem and is wreaking havoc on the equipment in our mechanical room. If we skip the liner and put in the air exchange, we will not solve our leak problem. The leak in the pool is substantial. Constantly adding water is expensive and leads to us having to spend more to heat and keep the water balanced with chemicals. The overall structure of the building is also at the end of its lifecycle.*

The Rocanville Aquatic Centre has been serving our community and surrounding communities since it opened in 1974

- Lessons provided to the following communities:
 - McAuley, Elkhorn, Moosomin, St.Lazare, Wapella, Boundary Lane
- On average the pool employs 6-10 students a year. Throughout the years the pool has employed approximately 300 students.
- Students who complete the Lifesaving Society National Lifeguard course can receive a credit on their high school transcripts
- The Rocanville Aquatic Centre has been providing swimming lessons to the students of Rocanville School since the pool opened (or very close to when the pool first opened – I don't have an exact date). Many families that would not have participated in summer lessons due to time or financial reasons have still been able to have swimming lessons provided to their children through the school lessons. I can only imagine how many possible drownings have been prevented because of this. Approximately 5,640 Rocanville students have received lessons at the Aquatic Centre this number does not include all of the kids that have taken lessons through our summer lesson sets.
- Morning and evening Aquafit classes have been running since the pool opened. We have people from Whitewood, Wapella, Moosomin, St.Lazare, Spyhill...attend these classes.
- We have recently started a Teen Aquafit class
- Sr. Swim has been provided for the past few years. This time is dedicated to adults only, it is a time for adults to come and do their own fitness routine, walk laps, swim laps, or just float in the pool.
- Many Lifesaving courses have been provided – Bronze Medallion, Bronze Cross, National Lifeguard, Lifesaving Instructor. With our pool being an indoor pool, we have been able to offer training early in the season before outdoor pools are open. This helps out communities with outdoor pools as their staff is able to receive training before their pool opens for the season. Last season we had student registrations from as far as Brandon and Regina.
- Water therapy is great for people with mobility difficulties. Our pool has provided opportunities for the Moosomin Kin Ability for many years.
- So many birthday parties have been celebrated at the Rocanville Aquatic Centre.
- Rocanville Tiger Shark Swim Team provides weekly revenue to the pool and is creating some very strong swimmers. Some of these swimmers may continue on to become lifeguards/instructors
- Our indoor pool sets us apart from other communities and supports our local businesses. People from other communities come to our pool for lessons, public swim fitness, etc, and then have the chance to stop in a shop at our stores.
