Unpaid Taxes

Please be aware that if you have unpaid taxes from 2014, your property may appear in the Tax Enforcement List published annually in *The World Spectator* each August.

Water Main Replacement

Our community's Water Treatment Plant, Wells and Sewage Lagoon are in excellent condition; however, our water distribution mains need to be replaced. They are on 'borrowed time' as they have exceeded their 40-year life expectancy. This replacement project will be both long-term and costly. Current utility rates will not generate the dollars needed to replace aging water mains.

To generate the funds required to complete this capital project, Town Council is increasing the Water and Sewer Infrastructure Fee from \$39 per quarter to \$94.50. This will generate an additional \$94,000 annually; sufficient to make meaningful progress. This increase will take effect August 1, 2015.

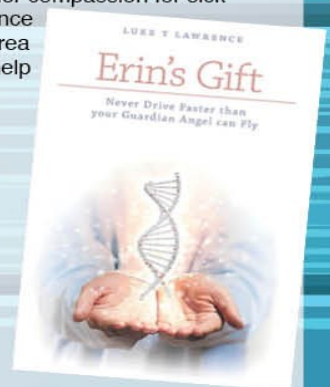

Teddy Bears Anonymous was founded by Luke Lawrence on December 2008 after the loss of his daughter, Erin. Erin Lawrence was predeceased by her mother in 1991. They both passed away from a very rare form of gastric cancer called Hereditary Diffuse Gastric Cancer (HDGC). It is because of the love Erin had for life and her compassion for sick children that we have Teddy Bears Anonymous today in hospitals in Saskatchewan. Luke Lawrence wrote and published a book called "Erin's Gift". It's Luke's hope that continued research in this area will someday develop a test to diagnose this disease in its earliest stages. In doing so, it would help in the prevention of unnecessary prophylactic gastrectomies.

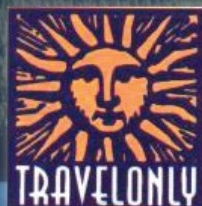

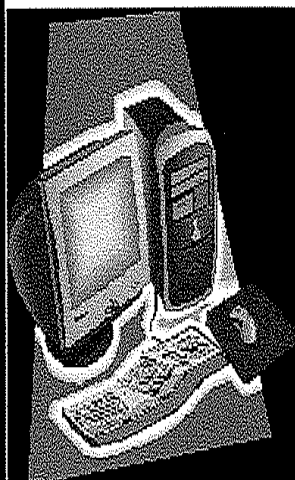

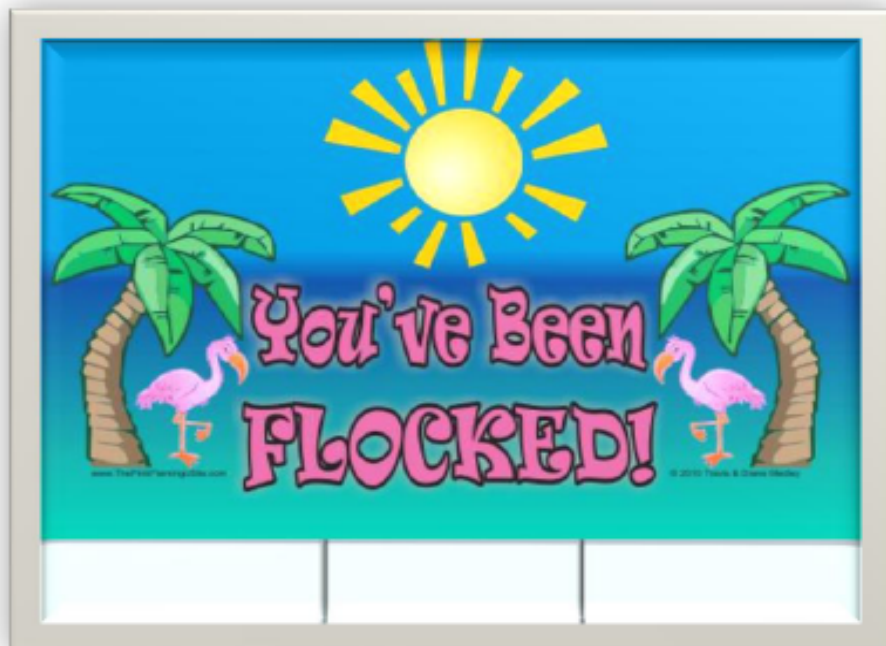

Common-law relationships, finance and the law

Understanding your rights is an important part of your overall financial plan.

Common-law relationships have become an increasingly popular choice for Canadians who want to share their lives together. In fact, according to Statistics Canada, the number of couples choosing to live common-law rose almost 14 per cent from 2006 to 2011 (close to three per cent more than the increase in married couples over the same time period). (1)

As more couples opt for common-law arrangements, there is a growing need to understand each partner's rights as an important aspect of successful financial planning. Note that legislation related to family law differs from one province or territory to another; for example, in some provinces, common-law spouses can share in property rights and in others they cannot. It's a good idea to seek legal advice regarding your rights if you and your spouse decide to live common-law.

Here are some measures that partners can take to help define their financial rights in a common-law relationship.

Sign a cohabitation agreement

A cohabitation agreement can be used to give common-law couples the same rights as married couples. It is a legal document that outlines details

such as how your property rights will be shared, how debt will be addressed, and whether or not assets will be equally divided. The benefit of a documented agreement is that it helps ensure you are both on the same page when it comes to your finances. It should be in writing and signed by both spouses.

Create a will

A will is another key component to your overall financial plan. A will is a written document that stipulates how you'd like your assets distributed and can also deal with your debt when you pass away. It is important that your will and your cohabitation agreement do not conflict with one another to avoid potential litigation.

Review beneficiary designations

When making a will or creating a cohabitation agreement, it's also a good time to review any current beneficiary designations you have in place. Confirm that your beneficiary designations for life insurance policies, TFSAs, RRSPs, and other investments (where permitted) are consistent with legal obligations set out in the

cohabitation agreement and your will.

Getting started

The process is complicated, but there are professionals that can help ensure you have a proper plan in place. A lawyer who specializes in family law can provide you with advice to ensure your rights are protected. At the same time, you may also wish to speak to an estate lawyer to help with your overall estate planning strategy. These professionals can work with your advisor to best address your particular situation.
