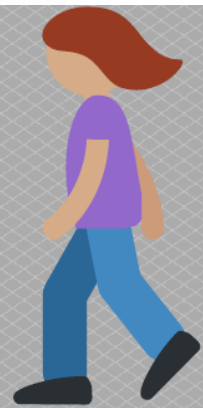

**A Christmas Poem for Teachers**

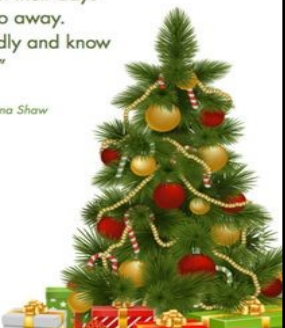
'Twas the week before Christmas at the elementary school

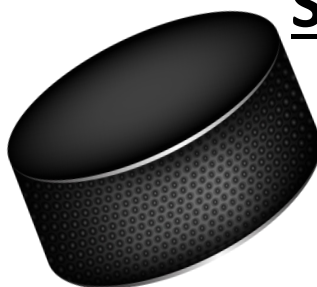
