Get S.M.A.R.T. about goalsetting

Realistic and well-defined objectives are more attainable than those that are vague.

After all, goals should set you up for success. One simple and effective method to help you succeed is to set S.M.A.R.T. goals. Here's an example of how it works:

Specific – Ensure your goal is specific, with as much detail as possible. Think of the who, what, when and why.

Instead of: "I want to start jogging." Consider: "I want to be able to do a 10-kilometre jog by the summer, so I can feel healthier."

Measurable – How are you doing? Knowing your progress along the way can help you reach your goal.

Instead of: "I will put my running shoes on." Consider: "I will use my fitness tracker to calculate my steps and distance each time I go for a run, and record the results in my journal."

Attainable – Determine how you will reach your objective. These are actionable steps you can take to get there.

Instead of: "I will jog every week." Consider: "I will jog

three times per week, starting with one kilometre in week one, two kilometres in week two and so on."

Realistic – This is all about managing expectations and being realistic about what you can achieve (and don't be too hard on yourself!). It's a good idea to think about how the goal will benefit you.

Instead of: "I will run the halfmarathon this spring." Consider "By starting low and working my way up to 10 kilometres, I will improve my stamina and endurance, and feel healthier."

Timely – Give yourself an end date! Recognize how much time you need to reach your goal (be realistic). It could be a good idea to set some timelines and plan ahead.

Instead of: "Spring." Consider: "April 30, 2020 – 12 weeks to reach 10 kilometres, including a two week buffer in case of unexpected circumstances."

Dream Big Child Care Directors Report

for Fiscal Year July 2020- June 30th, 2021

This Annual General Meeting reflects the past fiscal year. July 1st, 2020 – June 30th 2021.

We began last fall with a new team of staff. We continue to navigate the mandates from COVID and a balance between having staff off work who are symptomatic of the virus and the varying daily enrollment of children. All our direction comes from the public health orders. Thank you for your continued efforts to follow the expectations to keep the staff and children healthy.

This past year we replaced all the baseboards in the main areas with rubber baseboards. We purchased an industrial dishwasher that does a load in 5min and sanitizes everything with high temperature water. The front door was replaced, and the roof of the shade area was able to be tinned.

The Little Ceaser pizza fundraiser was a fantastic success and we will be doing it again in February.

In May we re-defied our program. Creating leadership roles for the front room and pre-school program. This allows the specific staff working with those age groups to concentrate on the developmental goals of the age group and have control over their work environment as well as more leadership opportunities for educators.

The government increased the amount of operating grants all centers receive, with the stipulation that the funds go directly to the wages of trained staff. Our wage grid was updated. Our ECEIII starting wage is one of the highest in the area. The goal is to encourage educators to further their education and attract and retain quality staff in our center.

The past 3 years have seen substantial change in the physical building, our wage grid, the quality of programming offered to the children, how the center operates daily, and staffing. Thru our continued attention to fiscal responsibility, our consistent 1% fee increase with inflation, and how the center is managed we have been able to cut the cost of operations and save for the future of the childcare center. As of October 1, 2021 the center has paid off the entire mortgage. This monthly savings will benefit the center and allow us to put more money into the daily program, the building and staffing costs. The board of directors is working towards offering additional benefits to all staff in the new year.

The Government of Saskatchewan thru the partnership with the bilateral agreement for funding from the Federal Government is working to create a better wage grid for trained staff across the entire province. All trained ECEI, II, III will be receiving an additional pay increase of \$1-3 depending on education level soon, with a Provincial wage grid expected in March 2022. The government is also working to increase the amount of quality trained staff working in the province. If you are interested in getting certified as an ECEI the entire upfront cost of the training, textbooks and even paid time to do schoolwork is being offered. Contact the center on how you can take advantage of this. There are also similar options for educators working towards their ECEII and ECEIII.

Parents can anticipate up to \$395 in savings for full time Infant space, \$333 for full time Toddler spaces and \$306 for full time pre-school spaces. The provincial goal is that every family will pay \$200 a month (or \$10 a day) for full time care, reducing fees is the first step. Families may be receiving a refund for childcare paid back to July 1st, 2021. Going forward at our center full time Infant spaces may be as low as \$280 a month.


