





Red Moon Road was formed in 2012 by Daniel Jordan, Sheena Rattai and Daniel Peloquin-Hopfner, 'Sorrows and Glories' (their third album) has delighted listeners worldwide. The three collaborative vet distinct writers frame immaculately crafted songs with original and innovative instrumental work. With tastes of Albertan country,

Parisian aires, banjo driven anthems and the tradition folk storytelling in a Canadiana style, the music carries the stories as compellingly as the lyrics. The Winnipeg folk trio is known for surviving adversity, spinning stories into songs and, more often, breaking hearts with stunning musicianship. Live, Red Moon Road makes a much bigger sound than one

would expect from a trio. In an impressive well-choreographed show, bordering on spectacle, the trio incorporates impeccable three-part harmonies, a roots drum kit split entertainingly but pragmatically between two band members and an acoustic guitar rigged to also be a bass.







RESPS - NOT JUST FOR KIDS - a Registered Education Savings Plan can be a smart investment strategy for adults.

MOST PEOPLE WHEN OF THINK REGISTERED EDUCATION SAVINGS PLANS (RESPS). But savvy investors can benefit from the plan as well. In fact, selffunded RESPs can be a great investment for adults who are planning to go back to school, and they can even be used as an income-splitting tool.

How do they work?

By opening an individual RESP and naming yourself both the subscriber and the beneficiary, you can contribute up to \$50,000 over the life of the plan. A variety of investments can be held in an RESP, including mutual funds and segregated fund contracts, and the investments can grow taxuntil vou make a withdrawal. This is valuable if you don't have any contribution in your registered Retirement Savings (RRSP) or <u>Tax Free</u> Savings Account. However, an RESP has a limited life - it must be closed within 36 years of being opened.

Unlike RESPs for children, RESPs for adults are not eligible for government incentives such as the Canada Education Savings Grant.

made to the beneficiary from the RESPs accumulated investment earnings, as well as applicable government incentives. The payments are taxed in the beneficiary's hands in the year of receipt. In order for a beneficiary to qualify for an EAP, he or she must be enrolled in a post-secondary level program at a qualifying educational institution for at least three consecutive weeks and correspondence classes count. In addition, you would be eligible for a tuition tax credit.

Not going back to school?

If you're over 21 and don't enroll at a qualifying post-secondary institution, and the plan has been open for more than 10 years, you can qualify for an Accumulated Income Payment (AIP). An AIP is a payment made from the investment earnings in the RESP; however, it does not include the original

contributions, nor government grants where applicable.

Unlike the EAP, an AIP withdrawal is subject to a penalty tax of 20 per cent (12 per cent federal tax plus eight percent provincial tax for residents of Quebec). addition to regular income tax, it is also important to note that the RESP must be closed prior to March 1, of the year after the first AIP payment is made. If you have contribution room left, you can transfer up to \$50,000 of AIPs into your RRSP or to a spousal RRSP. This will allow

Those who do not attend a postsecondary institution can use the RESP to split income. If your spouse is named as a joint subscriber to the RESP, and has contribution room left in his or her RRSP, the AIP can be transferred to your spouse's RRSP regardless of who made the contributions to the RESP. This is beneficial if one spouse is in a lower tax bracket, since the taxes paid when the funds are withdrawn will be lower.

Speak to your advisor

Whether you are interested in going back to school, looking for additional tax-deferred investment opportunities or thinking about income splitting, it might be worthwhile to consider an RESP. Speak with your advisor or tax specialist to find out if an RESP is right for your situation and your financial goals.

To avoid the penalty tax, the AIP must be contributed to an RRSP or spousal RRSP in the same year it is received, or within the first 60 days of the following year, and must be deducted in the same year received. A spouse or commonlaw partner as defined by the Income Tax Act (Canada).
