They sought the guidance of an advisor, who not only helped them to create a partnership agreement but also assessed other aspects of the business that could benefit from a fresh look.



1. Foreign materials were jammed in the propellers of the pumps, significantly reducing their capacity to pump. AGAIN we asked that only "Pee, Poop and Paper" is flushed down the toilets.

2. There is still a large number of sump pumps discharging into the Sewer System. The Town has a bylaw that prohibits discharging into the sewer system from May 1st to September 30, with fines up to \$10,000.

These last events cost the Town in excess of \$25,000. This has to be covered by the Town's Water & Sewer Fees.


Rocanville Senior's Centre






