DONATIONS GRATEFULLY ACCEPTED

The Aquatic Centre is a hub of training and recreation for our town. There are a large number of children in our school taking swimming lessons they may never have taken if it wasn't for this being offered through a school program. Rocanville has had many young people further their careers in aquatics or related fields because of the training they have received at our pool. Many programs are offered from swimming lessons, aquatic exercise, lifesaving skills, water sports, and even some water therapy for those recovering from medical issues. People travel to Rocanville from other communities around to take part in these activities since we have a unique INDOOR facility.

The town and RM have recently taken on a project to correct the flow of air in the facility to reduce the humidity in the building, however The Rocanville Aquatic Centre is facing some other large expenses going forward as the building is now nearing 50 years of age. As is visible from the outside of the building, we need to redo the roof at a cost of approx. \$70,000, the pool tank is in need of a new liner or major repairs in the near future at an estimated cost of \$106,000 plus taxes, the upper mezzanine has been out of use for the past couple of seasons due to the floor which is in need of replacement...a verbal estimate given was in the neighborhood of \$50,000 to repair using a material that would be long lasting and low maintenance. These are the needs but we have a list of wishes too, to enhance the facility such as an outdoor deck and green space so people can have the best of both worlds....and indoor pool with sunshine and fresh air.

We continue to fundraise and apply for grants, but as you may be aware the board consists of a small group of people who can't do it all so any amount of donation to these projects would be greatly appreciated. We thank you in advance for any amount you are willing to give. Receipts will be issued for tax purposes for any amount \$20 and over

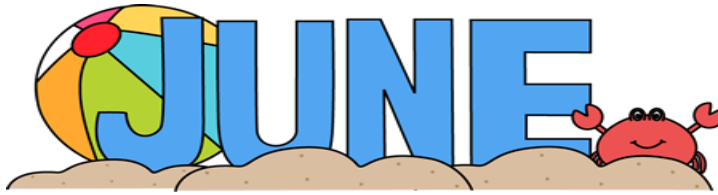

Large national companies wouldn't build in small rural communities which made the procurement of supplies difficult and the cost higher than most could afford. Local people (primarily farmers) seeing that the future of their community was in jeopardy if they did not find ways to cost effectively procure supplies banded together to create their Co-op.

Our Co-op has evolved to serve the members needs many times over the years. Originally, product was purchased in train car lots and members gathered to unload the train when product arrived. Coal, barrels of fuel, flour, salt, sugar, feed, lumber, twine fence posts and wire were the main products of the day. In its first year, sales were \$14,000 and the savings of \$200 was reinvested into the cooperative. Over the early years, the Co-op also coordinated livestock shipping by rail until trucking became a more cost-effective method of shipping. The first Co-op General Store was established in 1919 and began to stock some basic items so they were readily available to members. Again, savings were reinvested in the operation to add to the number of products available. Through the 50's, 60's and 70's the Co-op continued to grow with mergers of Orangeville and Spy Hill and the addition of the food store, a lumber yard and service station. In 1977, after the dissolution of the ill-fated Westland Co-op, Rocanville joined Moosomin, creating Borderland Co-op which has grown into a \$64 million operation returning millions to members thorough consistent equity allocations and general cash repayments.

Current operations in Rocanville employ 34 people in management, supervisory and frontline service positions with combined salaries near \$1 million per year which in turn feeds the local economy. The Board of Directors, made up of members who live and work in our communities, believes in the long term of Rocanville with multi-million-dollar investments in the C-Store and Cardlock project, renovations in the Home Centre and upgrading and replacement of refrigeration in the Food store to improve selection and reduce energy consumption costs. We are constantly working behind the scenes to improve processes, create opportunities for growth and drive costs out of operations to be able to be as competitive as possible in the face of urban lure and the convenience of online shopping.

Cooperation is vital in rural communities and it is not just about our Co-op business alone. This is inclusive of all local business ... private, cooperative and corporate alike. Business has a responsibility to serve the community to the best of its ability within the financial realities that exist, and the community has the responsibility to support their local economy within the financial realities that exist. It is a delicate balance with the future of a community at its core. We support REDO's mission and encourage everyone to shop local first!

Moving forward without moving out

Accessing your home equity can help boost your retirement income, ease pressure on your pensions and investments, and help you stay put.

In a recent survey of Canadian homeowners, only four in 10 respondents were confident they would have enough savings to maintain their lifestyle when they retire.
