Drinking Water Quality and Compliance Annual Notice to Consumers Town of Rocanville

Introduction

The Water Security Agency and the Ministry of Environment requires that at least once each year waterworks owners provide notification to consumers of the quality of water produced and supplied as well as information on the performance of the waterworks in submitting samples as required by a Minister's Order or Permit to Operate a waterworks. The following is a summary of the Town of Rocanville's water quality and sample submission compliance record for the January 1 – December 31, 2018 time period. This report was completed on November 21, 2018. Readers should refer to Water Security Agency's Municipal Drinking Water Quality Monitoring Guidelines, November 2002, EPB 202 for more information on minimum sample submission requirements and the meaning of type of sample. Permit requirements for a specific waterworks may require more sampling than outlined in the department's monitoring guidelines. A minimum of 0.1 milligrams per litre (mg/L) free chlorine residual is required for water entering the distribution system. Tests are normally performed on a daily basis by the waterworks operator and are to be recorded in operation records. This data includes the number of free chlorine residual tests performed, the overall range of free chlorine residual (highest and lowest recorded values) and the number of tests and percentage of results not meeting the minimum requirement of 0.1 mg/L free chlorine residual.

Chemical – Health Category

All waterworks serving less than 5000 persons are required to submit water samples for SE's Chemical Health category once every 2 years. The Chemical Health category includes analysis for arsenic, barium, boron, cadmium, chromium, fluoride, lead, nitrate, selenium and uranium.

The last sample for Chemical Health analysis was submitted on 21st November, 2018. Sample results indicated that the provincial drinking water quality standards were not exceeded.

All waterworks serving less than 5000 persons are required to submit water samples for SE's General Chemical category once every two years if a ground water source and once per three months every second year if a surface water or blended surface/groundwater source. The General Chemical category includes analysis for alkalinity, bicarbonate, calcium, carbonate, chloride, conductivity, hardness (as CaCO₃), magnesium, sodium, sulphate and total dissolved solids.

The last sample for General Chemical analysis was required on 2016 and submitted on August 24, 2016. Sample results indicated that there were no exceedences of the provincial aesthetic objectives for the General Chemical category.

*Objectives apply to certain characteristics of or substances found in water for human consumptive or hygienic use. The presence of these substances will affect the acceptance of water by consumers and/or interfere with the practice of supplying good quality water. Compliance with drinking water aesthetic objectives is not mandatory as these objectives are in the range where they do not constitute a health hazards. The aesthetic objectives for several parameters (including hardness as CaCO₃, magnesium, sodium and total dissolved solids) consider regional differences in drinking water sources and quality.

Camping Time



How to Remove a Tick

1. Use fine tipped tweezers to grasp the tick as close to the skin's surface as possible
2. Pull upward with steady, even pressure
Be careful you don't squeeze the tick!
3. Clean the area with alcohol, disinfectant or soap and water.
4. Save the tick! Send a picture and save your 7 digit confirmation number.
<http://forms.gov.mb.ca/tickSubmission/>
5. Mark the date and location of the tick bite in your calendar for future reference
6. Black legged ticks are known to carry Lyme and other related bacteria including Anaplasmosis and Babesiosis. **BE AWARE OF SYMPTOMS** and seek medical treatment!

DO NOT: squeeze, twist or rock the tick smother with soap or vaseline puncture the tick use heat such as a match or lighter

Causing injury or irritation to the tick may result in it regurgitating (vomiting) infective fluids into the host, potentially causing a serious infection

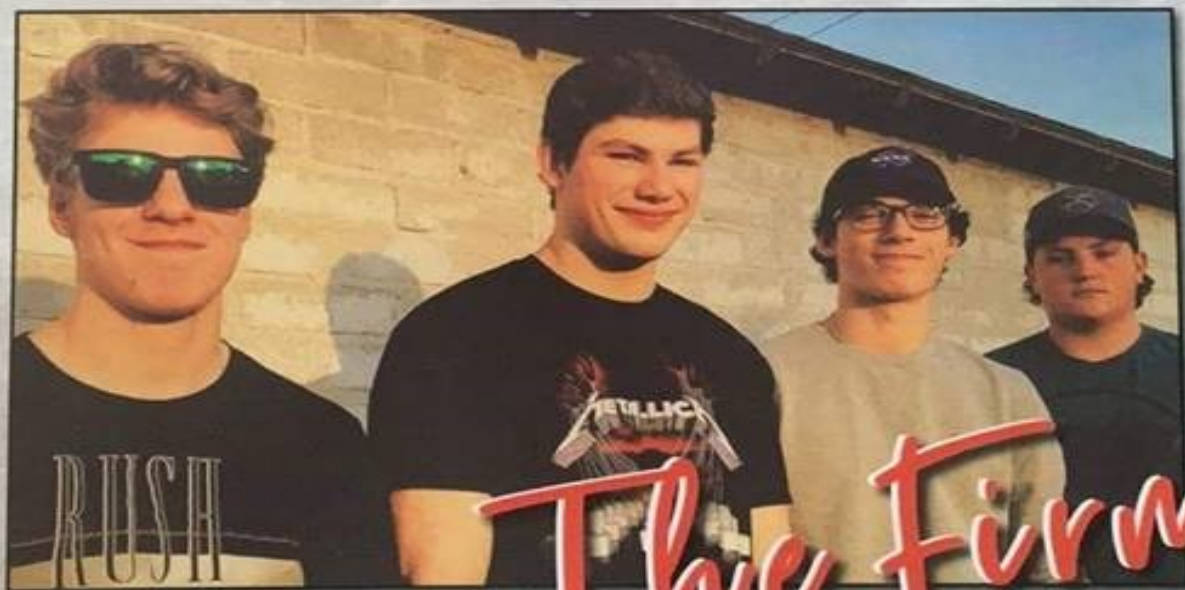

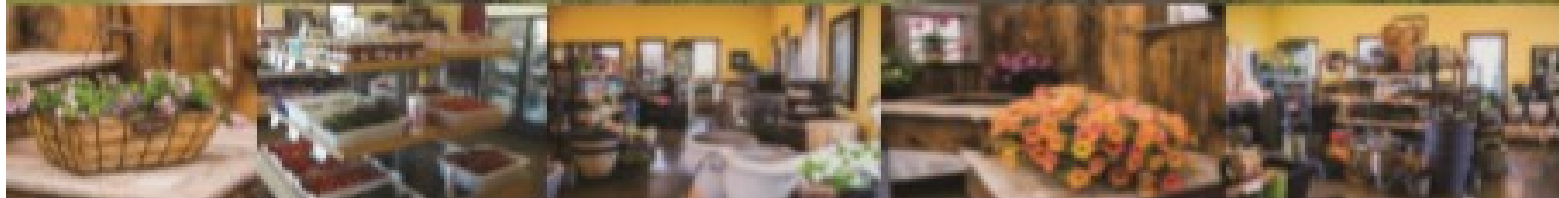

TAX SLIP SURPRISE

It's something that puzzles investors every tax season: they have an investment in a mutual fund or segregated fund contract that declined in value between January 1, and December 31, and yet they've received a tax slip listing taxable interest, dividends or capital gains. There's a straightforward reason for the tax slip: the fund has either received income (interest or dividends) from its underlying investments during the year or sold underlying investments at a capital gain. Even though the price of the fund has dropped, the taxes due on transactions within the fund have to be passed along to investors. Let's look at some examples to see how this works.

EXAMPLE 1: Imagine you own a small apartment building. The current value of the building may be less than when you purchased it, but you will still have to declare any rent you collect as income. In a fund, the principle is much the same. Any interest or dividend income earned by the fund's underlying investments must be taxed in the hands of investors – so investors receive a tax slip even though the fund's price has declined.

EXAMPLE 2: When you sell an investment that has increased in value, you may realize a capital gain. The capital gain is calculated as the difference between your selling price and your adjusted cost base (ACB). The ACB isn't always the purchase price. Rather, it's the amount of the investment that has already been taxed. A number of factors can affect your ACB. Similarly, when a fund

manager sells an investment that has increased in value, the fund realizes a capital gain – also calculated as the difference between the selling price and adjusted cost base. And, the gain is flowed through to the fund's investors. As a result, you may receive a tax slip for capital gains even if some of the capital gain occurred before you bought your units and even if the value of your units has dropped. For simplicity, let's assume a fund holds only one stock and you are the only investor. You paid \$100 for your investment on January 1. On December 31, the value of the investment is \$80. However, the fund manager bought the one stock 10 years ago for \$10. If the manager sold the stock on June 30 when the stock was valued at \$85, the fund would realize a capital gain of \$75. As the only investor, you would have to report this \$75 capital gain on your tax return – even though the value of your investments has dropped. That said, investors never pay tax on more than they actually make in profit. After you pay tax on the \$75 capital gain, your ACB increases by \$75 – in this example, to \$175. If you sell the investment while the price is still \$80, you will realize a capital loss of \$95. If you wait and sell the investment when the price is \$150, you will still realize a capital loss of \$25 even though the value of your investment rose to \$150 from your purchase price of \$100. **DISCUSS TAX MINIMIZATION STRATEGIES WITH US**

There are a number of approaches you can take to reduce the impact of reported capital gains on your

taxes. For example, if the value of your fund units is lower than your ACB, you could sell to realize a capital loss and then reinvest the money in a different fund. In the example above, you could sell at \$80 and realize a capital loss of \$95, which more than offsets the \$75 capital gain generated by activity within the fund. If you have no other capital gains reported, you can use the remaining \$20 capital loss to offset capital gains in the three previous years or in any future year. Your advisor can recommend that best strategy for your situation. The value of your investment has dropped from \$100 to \$80, but you receive a tax slip of \$75 in capital gains and your ACB increases to \$175.
