




My name is Grace Deptuck and I would like to help inner city kids in Regina this Christmas by doing a TOY DRIVE.







Frequently asked questions regarding the flu shot

Does the seasonal flu vaccine really work?

Approximately 70-90% of healthy people will have protection from the flu virus once vaccinated. It takes a few weeks to become effective, so it is possible to catch the flu within that time period. Of the 10-30% of people who may still get the flu even after the vaccination, they will have much milder symptoms.

When is the best time of year to activity get the flu shot? 30 minutes

Anytime during flu season, October to April. However, the earlier the better, as it takes a few weeks to take full effect.

What risks are associated with the flu shot?

site of injection. Contrary to myth, a flu shot cannot cause the flu, since it does not contain a live virus.

Will I need to be vaccinated against new strains of flu, like the H1N1 virus?

Flu shot requirements change every year. To help protect yourself against new flu strains, it is important to get re-vaccinated every year. For example, in 2009, Canadians received not only the seasonal flu shot, but also additional injections (depending on age) to fight H1N1.

Can other vaccinations be given at the same time as the flu shot?

Yes, in fact, it is recommended that all senior patients receive the pneumonia vaccine if they have not already done so at the time of the flu shot. Patients over 50 should also discuss having the shingles vaccine administered if they have not already done so on the same day as their flu shot.


