Career Reboot - Managing the financial impact when you change paths. When Workopolis recently asked Canadians how many career paths they had followed, just on in four replied "one". A clear majority had switched directions at some point – whether because they had discovered a new field they felt passionate about, or because they hit roadblocks such as a lack of advancement, cutbacks or layoffs. So if you are contemplating a career change, you're not alone. And whether a leap into another profession is by choice or necessity, smart financial planning can help protect your household budget and keep you on track towards a comfortable retirement.

Build your skill set – Your transition may be just around the corner – after all, nearly half of employed Canadians (45 percent) expect to change jobs or careers during the next five years. Yet 29 percent don't feel ready for a new line of work based on the skills they currently have. One way to prepare for a career change – whether it's anticipated or not – is to deepen existing transferable skills and acquire new ones.

Workplace and government funding – Your employer may offer opportunities to attend free in-house workshops and seminars. If you can make a case for it, your organization may even pay or share costs for you to enroll in external programs. However, an employer isn't likely to approve your request to study something that's entirely unrelated to your current jobs, so if you're headed in a new direction you may have to look for other sources of financing. Government support may be available to help with the costs of retraining. The federal government's Skills Boost program, for example, provides grants and loans for education for those who qualify. Your provincial or territorial government may offer assistance as well. If not, you may have to dip into your own savings.

Financing options – while Registered Education Savings Plans (RESPs) are usually set up for children, you can set one up for yourself to save money specifically for retraining in an eligible full-time or part-time program. You won't receive Canada Education Savings Grants (CESGs), which are not available after age 17. However, you can take advantage of tax deferred investment growth, which can help you build education savings faster. You can also borrow up to \$20,000 (up to 10,000 within a calendar year) from your Registered Retirement Savings Plan (RRSP) through the Lifelong Learning plan if you enroll in an eligible full-time program. You do not have to pay tax on the amount you withdraw as long as you repay it according to the schedule set by the Canada Revenue Agency. As with an RESP or RRSP, money compounds without taxes inside a Tax-Free Savings Account (TFSA), with two important additional benefits. You can withdraw any amount tax-free, and you're not limited to studying in an "eligible" program. A TFSA can work well alongside an RESP and/or the Lifelong Learning Plan, providing an extra source of money with no strings attached. And, of course, savings in non-registered accounts are also available to you if you need them – just be aware that selling investments outside a registered plan may trigger taxable capital gains.

Prepare for the financial impact – Even if you don't need to go back to school, changing careers can have significant financial consequences. You can soften the impact by planning ahead. Given how common career changes are, it's probably a good idea for every Canadian to implement at least some of these strategies.

Strengthen finances so they can handle a drop in income – Many Canadian households are close to the edge when it comes to their finances. Nearly half (47 percent) are living pay cheque to pay cheque,

saying they struggle to meet financial obligations if they received a pay cheque even one week late. Yet a career change may involve a drop in income if you're unemployed for a period time, earn less as you start up a new venture or take a pay cut to pursue your dream job. To make your finances more resilient and able to withstand a period with less income, consider: trimming expenses so there's more money left at the end of each month, working to pay down your debt to reduce your interest payments, setting up a line of credit as source of lower-interest funds if you need them, building an emergency fund in an easy-to-access bank account. With stronger finances, you'll have more flexibility to make career decisions without worrying about how you'll pay this month's bills.

Town of Rocanville

BYLAW NO. 2019 – 02

A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONTROL OF DOGS AND CATS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF ROCANVILLE.

The Council of the Town of Rocanville in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. This Bylaw shall be known as the “Dog and Cat Control Bylaw”.
2. Any person residing in the Town shall not own, possess or harbor a dog or cat that without provocation shows aggressive attitudes towards any persons, other dogs or cats.
 - a) “Aggressive” shall mean:
 - i) any dog without provocation, in a vicious or menacing manner, chased or approached a person or domestic animal in an apparent attitude of attack;
 - ii) any dog having an inclination, tendency or disposition to attack without provocation, to cause injury or to otherwise threaten the safety of persons or domestic animals;
 - iii) any dog which has without provocation, bitten, inflicted injury, assaulted or otherwise attacked a person or domestic animal;
 - iv) any dog owned primarily or in part for the purpose of dog fighting or is trained for dog fighting;

but shall not include:

- i) any dog acting in the performance of police work; or
 - ii) any dog working as a guard dog on commercial property:
 - securely enclosed on the property by a fence or other barrier sufficient to prevent the escape of the dog and the entry of children of tender years;
 - defending that property against a person who was committing an offence.
3. Any person residing in the Town who owns, possesses or harbors a dog or cat, shall ensure that the animal does not run at large within the Town, and for the purposes of this bylaw, a dog or cat shall be deemed to be running at large when it is beyond the boundaries of the land occupied by the owner, possessor, or visitor.
 - i) Securely confined with an enclosure: or
 - ii) Securely fastened (on a leash or chain) so that the animal cannot roam at will.
- b) “Owner” includes:

- i) a person who keeps, possesses or harbours a dog;
 - ii) the person responsible for the custody of a minor where the minor is the owner of a dog;

but does not include:

- i) a veterinarian registered in accordance to The Veterinarians Act, 1987, who is keeping or harbouring a dog for the prevention, diagnosis or treatment of a disease or injury; or
 - ii) an urban or rural municipality, the Saskatchewan Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to animals, a local Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals or a Humane Society operating pursuant to The Animal Protection Act, with respect to an animal shelter or impoundment facility operated by any of them.

- c) “provocation” means an act done intentionally for the purpose of provoking a dog.
4. Any owner who’s dog or cat is found guilty of an aggressive act shall be liable to a penalty of \$500.00, and should a person who harbors an “aggressive pet” not remove the animal within 48 hours, an additional penalty of \$100.00 per day shall be applied to the original \$500.00 penalty.
4. An owner who’s dog or cat is found running at large after a first offence shall be liable to a penalty of \$250.00 and subsequent penalties of \$250 for every occurrence after the initial penalty.
5. An owner may voluntarily pay the penalty as specified in this bylaw to the Town of Rocanville upon being served with summons within the time specified in the summons, and upon payment shall not be liable to prosecution under this bylaw.
6. No other pets as listed on Schedule “A” shall be brought into the Town of Rocanville without a permit from the Town Council.
7. Bylaws # 94/5, 2009-22 and 2014-02 are hereby repealed.
7. This bylaw shall come into force and take effect upon the date adopted by Council.

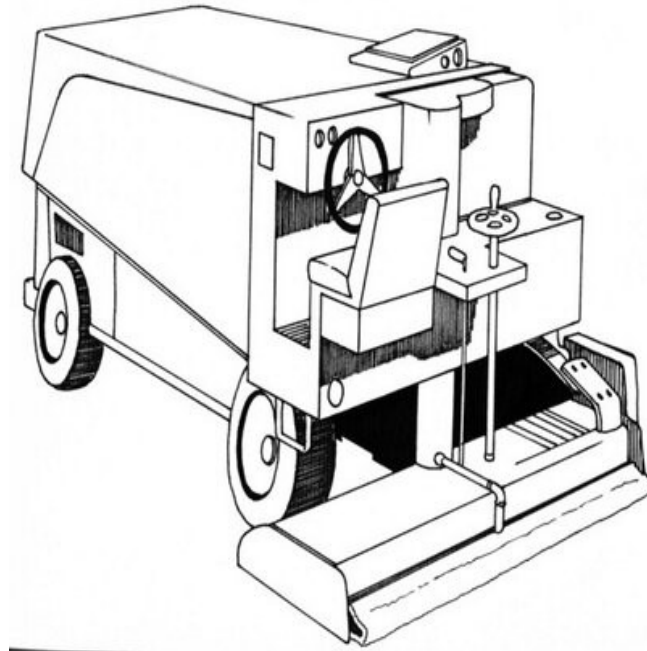

Schedule "A"

Prohibited Animals

The following is a list of animals the keeping of which is prohibited within the Town of Rocanville:

- (a) All Arachnids dangerous to humans (such as scorpions and tarantulas, except tarantulas of the genera Aphonopelma, Avicularia, and Grammostola);
- (b) All Artiodactylus Ungulates (such as goats, sheep, cattle, pigs and llamas);
- (c) All Bats;
- (d) Canids of the following breeds or mixed breeds: Rottweiler, Pit Bull, Doberman Pinscher;
- (e) All Cocodilians (such as alligators, crocodiles and caimans);
- (f) All Edentates (such as anteaters, sloths, and armadillos);
- (g) All Elephants;
- (h) All Felids, except the domestic cat;
- (i) All Hyenas;
- (j) All Marsupials (such as kangaroos and opossums);
- (k) All Mustelids (such as skunks, weasels, otters, and badgers) except the domestic ferret;
- (l) All non-human Primates (such as gorillas and monkeys);
- (m) All Perissodactylus Ungulates (such as horses, donkeys, mules and asses);
- (n) All Pinnipeds (such as seals, fur seals and walruses);
- (o) All Procyonids (such as raccoons, coatis and cacomistles);
- (p) All Raptors, diurnal and nocturnal (such as eagles, hawks and owls);
- (q) All Ratite Birds (such as ostriches, rheas, and cassowaries);
- (r) All Galliformes (such as chickens, turkeys, grouse, quails and pheasants);
- (s) All Anseriformes (such as ducks and geese);
- (t) All snakes of the families Pythonidae and Boidae;
- (u) All Ursids (bears);
- (v) All venomous Reptiles and Amphibians;
- (w) All Viverrids (such as mongooses, civets and genets).

Examples of animals of a particular prohibited group are given in parentheses. They are examples only and shall not be construed as limiting the generality of the group.

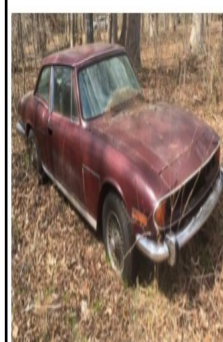

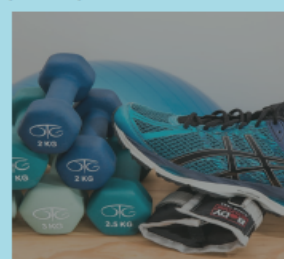
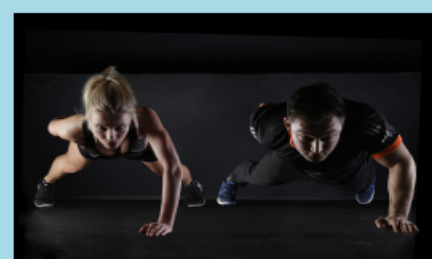
